We are looking for an energetic, creative and efficient person with a strong commitment to the type of work we do to be our new Designer/junior researcher. This is an exciting interdisciplinary role for someone with good design skills who wants to strengthen their skills in social research.

This is a new post for Social Life.

This job is being offered on an initial six-month contract, we hope to be able to extend this after this first six months.

The job will include:

- designing infographics, leaflets, reports and other outputs
- helping to maintain the Social Life website
- providing research support on particular projects, which could include one to one interviews, admin tasks or carrying out practical projects in local areas
- taking responsibility for coordinating the Social Life office.

We are looking for someone with:

- a good understanding of Social Life's work and what motivates us
- an interest in neighbourhoods, cities and participatory research
- very good design skills including using Adobe Creative Suite, especially InDesign, *preferably* with experience of applying these on social research or built environment projects
- excellent written and verbal communication skills
- some research knowledge and/or experience
- initiative and good organisational skills
- the confidence to carry out one to one engagement and interviews, after training
- the interpersonal skills to work collaboratively in our small friendly team
- desirable: some experience of data mapping, using QGIS.
