This job is being offered on a six-month contract, we may be able to extend this after this first period, depending on funding and income generation.

The job will include:

- working on particular projects including quantitative research, secondary data analysis, data mapping and visualisation
- project managing and taking responsibility for small projects and initiatives
- supporting the wider team on qualitative research and practical projects
- taking part in the day to day management and administration of the Social Life office.

We are looking for someone with:

- · a good understanding of Social Life's work and what motivates us
- excellent knowledge of and experience in data analysis using excel and preferably SPSS
- strong knowledge of UK datasets, particularly those used to carry out socio-economic studies
- knowledge and experience of data mapping and visualisation, using open-sourced software such as QGIS, Carto, etc
- some knowledge of planning, urbanism, housing, community development or a related field of Social Life's work
- ideally qualitative research experience, but if not the enthusiasm and proven capability of supporting qualitative research
- excellent written and verbal communication skills, and the ability to deal with challenging situations and stakeholders in a sensitive manner
- confidence and initiative to spot what needs to be done, to deal with ambiguity and to work creatively
- someone who can work collaboratively in our small friendly team
- Desirable: design skills experience designing reports and other materials in InDesign.
